



Guidance for members undertaking the Alpine Level 3 and Level 4 Courses

Technical courses:

Level 3 & Level 4 IASI technical exams are split into '**exam prep**' and '**exam**' courses each of 3-days duration. The exam prep courses are designed to get you ready to 'perform' at your best while the exam courses are purely assessment. This means that you need to be performing at or above the level required and meeting **ALL** assessment criteria during the 3-day exam.

During the Alpine Level 3 & 4 Technical exams you are assessed on your **Technical** performance. These criteria are available as 'stand alone' documents and are also contained within the relevant course workbooks all of which are available to download from the documents page, in the members area, on the IASI website.

Please note that the exam prep is not mandatory but it is recommended as a great way to get yourself ready to give your best performance.

To prepare for the exam prep and exam courses, at both levels, members have the option of taking the **Skills Development Course** (SDC). These courses are specifically designed to develop and practice all the skills necessary for the exams.

Teaching modules:

The Level 3 and Level 4 **Teaching modules** are both of 6-days duration. They are delivered on a continual assessment basis. Please be aware that the required teaching hours are very much a minimum requirement and it is recommended that members try to exceed the minimum and gain a wide range of teaching experience at all levels.

The method of assessment for all courses is a simple PASS or FAIL against each of the assessment criteria.
